**1.1 Discussion of 2008 Legislative Issues**

**Council Member Brad Markus** introduced those in attendance and invited the elected Senators and Representatives to address their concerns for the upcoming Legislative Session.

**Senator Howard Stephenson** gave a brief summary of the Equalization Bill, indicating that this was a priority on his agenda for the new Legislative Session.

**Representative Todd Kiser** remarked that the legislative session starts next week with 1000 prospective bills. He commented that as a Representative he felt it was important to hear from the Mayors and City

Council Members and welcomed any comments from the group. He also indicated his support for the Mt. View Corridor and would like to receive input on the subject.

**Representative Carl Wimmer:** Discussed the importance of the Equalization Bill, and the need to support it. He also supports a bill in progress that makes it difficult for special groups to sue major development projects like the Legacy Highway or the proposed Mt. View Corridor. He also desires to review the Unified Police Department.

**Representative Merlynn Newbold:** Spoke of her support for the Equalization Bill. She also discussed transportation issues and the Mt. View Corridor.
