City Wide Clean Up

Dumpsters will be available for residential clean of non hazardous green waist and trash beginning April 7-21. The dumpsters will be placed in the new main city park at 14400 South 2200 West. Items such as tires, batteries, oil, gas or any flammable fluid, large appliances, paint will not be accepted. Also, please separate green waist (tree limbs, shrubs, flowers, plants, etc.) from the trash as we plan on chipping the wood products to make mulch for our City trees. Wood with nails, staples, tacks, metal edging, or any other metal will disqualify it from green waist.

PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED FOR ROADWAY IMPROVEMENTS TO REDWOOD ROAD

UDOT has conducted an Environmental Study to evaluate alternatives for improvements to S.R. 68 from Bangerter Highway through Pony Express (7200N) in Saratoga Springs. The goal of the study was to determine an alternative that will address future capacity needs, ensure a safe transportation facility, and improve the roadway to meet current design standards. A preferred alternative has been developed that includes four travel lanes with a center turn lane, a bike lane and shoulders, improved intersections, and sidewalks in some areas. GEOCACHING IN THE PARK

Students from North Star Academy in Bluffdale are in the City Park in preparation for burying their Geocache. Geocaching is an outdoor treasure-hunting game in which the participants use a Global Positioning System (GPS) receiver or other navigational techniques to hide and seek containers (called "geocaches" or "caches") anywhere in the world. Today, well over 350,000 geocaches are currently placed in 222 countries around the world, which are registered on various websites devoted to the sport.
