**BLUFFDALE CITY CITIZEN'S REFERENDUM
ELECTION REGISTRATION**

The Bluffdale City Referendum Election will be held on June 26, 2007. To vote in the election you must be a registered voter. Voters may register in person with the Salt Lake County Elections Office at 2001 South State Street, #S1100, in Salt Lake City. The deadline to register in person is 15 days before the election (June 11, 2007). Absentee Voting will take place at the City Records office, 14350 South 2200 West, up until the Monday before the election (June 25, 2007). Early voting will take place at the City Records office, 14350 South 2200 West, 14 days before the election - June 12, 2007 thru June 22, 2007 - Monday thru Friday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. For more information call 254-2200. A voter information pamphlet will be mailed to all residents in June.

SIGN PERMITS

Hi, my name is Craig Rasmussen and I am the Bluffdale City Code Enforcement Officer. As I have become aware of all the duties of my office, I have found that there seems to be a bit of a misunderstanding as to our signage ordinance. So as an educational insight, I would like to remind the Bluffdale citizens that in most cases permits are necessary.

Section 12.15.5.4 states... "all moveable, freestanding signs, including freestanding A-frame signs are prohibited. This prohibition shall include signs mounted or painted upon vehicles or trailers which are parked in any location for the purpose of calling attention to or advertising a person, place, or thing. Any sign, handbill, poster, advertisement or notice of any kind or sort fastened, placed, posted, painted, or attached in any way on any curbstone, lamp post, telephone pole, power pole, hydrant, fence, tree, sidewalk, or street is prohibited."



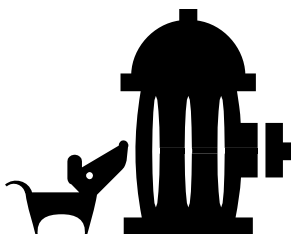
Section 12.15.9.5 states... "Open house signs advertising real estate open for inspection for a prospective sale may be placed on private property... [but] shall not exceed 6 square feet... and shall not require a building permit."

Section 12.15.9.12 states... "Garage sale signs shall not be placed on or over a public way. Each garage sale shall not exceed two (2) days..."

Any non-conforming signs shall be picked up and disposed of every two weeks. Any questions or concerns please contact the Bluffdale City Code Enforcement at 254-2200. Please help us help you as citizens keep our city clean and beautiful in appearance and atmosphere.

HOSE BIB VACUUM BREAKER

A HVB is needed on all hose connections. HVB are fairly inexpensive and easy to install. They can be purchased where plumbing supplies are sold. For best results get a freeze proof, self-draining hose bib vacuum breaker.



Remember never submerge a hose in a horse trough, bucket, pool or sink.

FILING DATE FOR CITY COUNCIL MEMBERS

Bluffdale City is announcing the Declaration of Candidacy for three At Large City Council seats for the upcoming general election.

Applications will be available July 2 - July 16, 2007. Applications are available at the Fire Station at 14350 South 2200 West, Monday through Friday from 8:30 am until 5:00 pm.

Candidates must meet the following qualifications:

1. Be a United States Citizen
2. Be at least 18 years of age by the municipal election day.
3. Be a resident of Bluffdale City for at least 12 consecutive months.
4. Be a registered voter.

ELECTION POLL WORKERS NEEDED

With local elections fast approaching and a 2008 Presidential Primary not far behind, the Salt Lake County Clerk's Elections Division is recruiting several thousand poll workers to staff the polls on Election Days.

To help cope with the challenge, the county is introducing its "Partners in Democracy" program, aimed at recruiting local businesses, non-profit organizations and individuals to encourage poll worker service. Each volunteer will receive a minimum \$120 stipend, in addition to commendations from the mayor and publicity from the local media and the division's website.
