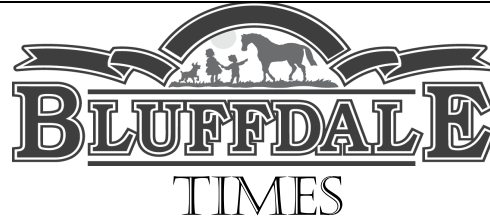

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

This month I decided to focus on the ability of the city to respond to an emergency in the city.

One of the responsibilities of the city is to provide for the safety and security of each resident in the city. We have very capable first responders in the city but I want to focus on providing for the safety and security of the city in case of a disaster of a magnitude which would limit our first responders availability to respond to the many needs in the city which would occur simultaneously.

If a major disaster were to happen in the city, like an earthquake, each resident will need to be able to self-provide for a period of time. The city is in the position to best be able to organize the self-rescue capabilities of the residents in conjunction with other organizations. We currently have some emergency response capabilities in the city but we have areas we need to improve.

In the past, and currently, we have depended on a volunteer to be the city's Emergency Response Coordinator. This position requires many hours of training and many hours to coordinate the needs of the city. This position is key in preparing and organizing the city's resources for immediate and appropriate response in case of future disasters.
