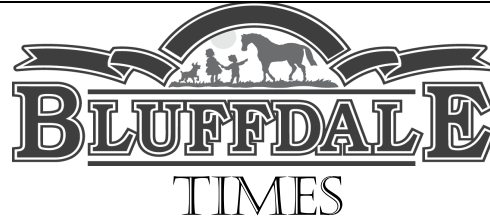

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

As Mayor I feel it is critical for Bluffdale to develop good long-term working relationships with other cities to benefit our long term planning. I regularly attend meetings to help build upon the four C's - commonalities, connectivity, communication, and collaboration - which are important in building a formula for a successful community.

One of those meetings is the Salt Lake County Council of Governments (COG) which is made up of the mayors of each municipality in Salt Lake County along with a representative of each city of the first class, two council members from the county council as well as the County Mayor. Therefore, as Mayor of Bluffdale I'm a member of COG.

The COG usually deals with issues which cross city boundaries and need coordination between the different parties involved such as air quality, transportation, public safety, human services, arts and humanities, and intergovernmental relations. The major issues are dealt with first in subcommittees and then are brought before the COG. I'm a member of the human services and housing, physical resources, public works, and the arts and humanities committees.

I have also been appointed to the Regional Growth Committee (RGC) through the COG. The RGC serves as the policy advisory body to the Regional Council on long range land use and other growth issues. The RGC is responsible for the Regional Long Range Transportation Plan and developing regional growth planning strategies in cooperation with local governments, UDOT, UTA, and other organizations.

I'm also a member of the Conference of Mayors COM. The 17 Mayors in Salt Lake County meet monthly to openly discuss issues which are of common interest.

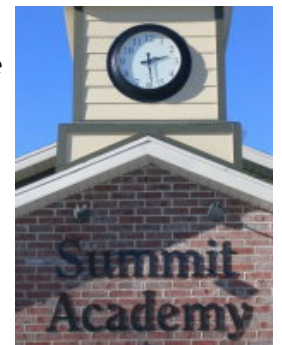
Nine months ago myself, Mayor Applegarth of Riverton, and Mayor Mills of Herriman decided to start a Tri-City Mayors meeting. We meet monthly to discuss issues which pertain to our three cities.

I will be hosting the Conference of Mayors in Bluffdale this month and look forward to showing off our great city to the other mayors of the county. I hope each of you is as proud of being a resident of Bluffdale as I am.

DO YOU KNOW... Summit Academy is building a high school in Bluffdale. Summit Academy High School will be a public charter school. A public charter school does not charge a fee for attendance. Applicants are chosen through a lottery system. The school is slated to be open this coming 2011-12 school year. Open Enrollment will begin on January 1, 2011. Summit uses a software application to randomly assign each new student applicant a priority number for the selection process. This helps ensure the selection process is open and fair to all applicants.

If you are interested Summit Academy will be holding an open house in January for Bluffdale residents. The city's web site (www.bluffdale.com) will have more information once the date is determined. BLUFFDALE BUSINESS SPOTLIGHT MAVERIK

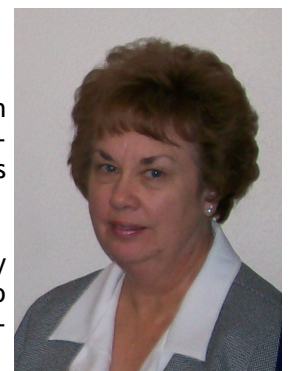
